Life Lesson 90 *Jehu*

Text: II Kings 8 – 10:36

Introduction

Ever since Omri defeated Zimri, the family of Omri ruled Israel. And ever since Omri began to reign, Israel had a wicked king.

The Story

Omri was bad enough, but his son Ahab was the worst of all the bad kings of Israel. He encouraged the people to worship Baal. Baal, or Baalzebub, is another name for the devil. You can see how very wicked Ahab was! His wife, Jezebel, spurred him on to do evil things. She even had an innocent man killed because he wouldn't sell his land to Ahab.

King Ahaziah, Ahab's son, and King Jehoram, his second son who was king after Ahaziah, weren't a bit better as king. The whole family was evil. Since they refused to repent, God took the kingdom away from their family.

"Take this box of oil," Elisha told one of the other prophets. "Go to Ramoth-Gilead and anoint Jehu to be the new king of Israel. That is what God has commanded for us to do."
